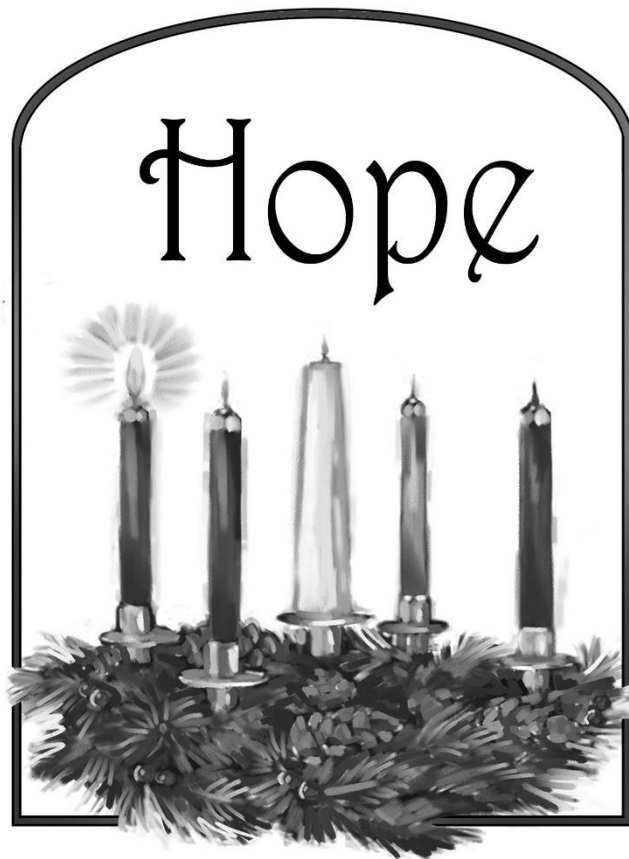

The Nicene Creed

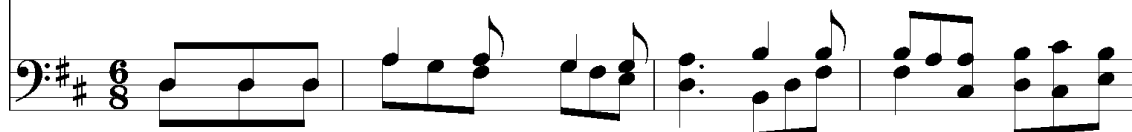


